What is the role?

- To work at all times to a rehabilitation philosophy enabling service users to be as independent as possible.
- To welcome service users' home from hospital/ inpatient unit, evaluating assessments completed on the ward and ensuring continuity of care.
- Take responsibility for assessing service users' progress and evolving needs, reviewing care
 plans regularly, and implementing appropriate updates in collaboration with the
 multidisciplinary team (MDT) and with active involvement from the service user.
- To support the service user with the onward care arrangements utilising available resources and referring to our Adult Social Care colleagues.
- To assist service users in a range of daily living tasks, for example with transfers, mobility, washing and dressing, toileting, household tasks, meal preparation, social activity and access to the community.
- To have an understanding and implementation of safe moving and handling, promoting health and safety for service users.
- To have well developed oral and written communication skills and the ability to keep clear, precise, timely and accurate records.
- To supervise, observe and monitor the performance of Rehabilitation Assistants and identify training if required.
- To provide senior cover in the absence of the Case Coordinator, offering advice and recognising where escalation may be required.
- Demonstrate the ability to work independently and collaboratively within a team, while confidently identifying and escalating concerns through appropriate channels to ensure service user safety and quality of care.
- To attend regular supervision sessions and participate in team meetings.

Who is the person?

You need to have:

- Have experience of working in a health or social care setting, including experience working with adults within a rehabilitation setting.
- Have experience of undertaking personal care within a relevant setting.
- Demonstrate a clear understanding of the impact that disability can have on individuals' daily lives, wellbeing, and independence.
- Work as an effective and valued member of the service team, contributing actively to multidisciplinary discussions, sharing insights, and supporting collaborative decision-making to enhance service user outcomes.
- Have the ability to be patient and promote dignity, choice and rights.
- Able to record, report, and escalate information clearly, accurately, and in a timely manner.
- Be able to maintain confidentiality.
- Be flexible and able to adjust to changing needs of the service.
- Work flexibly between the hours of 7am and 10pm in order to meet the needs of the service. This includes working 1 in 4 weekends.
- Must have a full driving licence and access to a vehicle for work purposes.
- Have excellent communication skills and the ability to converse at ease with customers and provide advice.

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
